

IMMIGRATION TODAY IN THE UNITED STATES

U.S. Immigration At-A-Glance

- There are approximately 44 million immigrants in the US in 2022
- One out of 8 residents in the country was born abroad
- Mexico has the largest number of nationals living in the US, with 26.6% of the total. China comes right after Mexico with 6.3%
- About 23% of immigrants in the US are undocumented
- Almost half of all the immigrants in the US, 49.6%, receive citizenship
- Immigrants have a higher participation rate in the workforce (66.4%) than citizens born in the US (62.8%)
- About a quarter (25%) of new businesses are started by immigrants each year
- Most of the undocumented immigrants in the past years come from Mexico (48%), El Salvador (7%), Guatemala (7%) and India (5%)
